

Sex Offender Agreement 0418-21-WFSO

Q: Are my staff working toward LCMHCA eligible to serve SOS clients?

A: The proposal states that staff be licensed as stated below (local need*):

The Masters or Doctoral Level Practitioner must be credentialed in North Carolina at a **minimum** with **one** of the following:

Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW)

NC Board of Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor (NCBLCMHC) formerly known as NC Board of Licensed Professional Counselor (NCBLPC)

Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor Associate (LCMHCA) formerly known as Licensed Professional Counselor Associate (LPCA)

Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor (LCMHC) formerly known as Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC)

Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor Supervisor (LCMHCS) formerly known as Licensed Professional Counselor Supervisor (LPCS)

No, staff must have that credential at the time of submission of this agreement. We will need to verify credentials at review to determine if your proposal is technically acceptable. If awarded, and staff credentials have changed you are required to update and resubmit the Attachment C.

Q: Is proposal to be submitted by email only?

A: Yes, at this time, due to COVID-19.

Q: Please explain "discount for prompt payment" (# 9)

A: Discounts for prompt payment will not be considered in the evaluation of offers. Typically, payment is made within 30 days of receipt of invoice. If you do offer a discount and we can meet the terms for that discount we will apply the discount.

Q: Is "Supervising Officer" the same as probation officer? (10)

A: Yes, also known as United States Probation Officer, USPO, USPSO, – refers to the individual responsible for the direct supervision of a client receiving treatment services.

Q: How are we reimbursed for case staffing conference and consultation? Section B

A: The price of case staffing conferences and consultations are included in the prices in Section B. The section below further describes.

See G- 3 of 4 (j. and k.)

j. The vendor shall include the cost of written reports and conferences with the USPO/USPSO in the prices for defendant/offender services unless the Program Plan authorizes them as part of a specific service (e.g., Intake Assessment and Report (2011), Psychological Evaluation and Report (5010)).

k. The vendor shall include the cost of telephone contacts with defendants/offenders in the unit price for the services and shall not bill separately for these calls.

Q: Section F1 -b refers to bed space but we are an outpatient facility.

A: This is applicable to inpatient services and not outpatient services.
